Dear Parents and Caregivers:

Please remember it is important for all students to have a COVID-19 symptom assessment at home prior to leaving for school each day. Health checks should include taking temperatures and assessing symptoms. Symptoms of COVID-19 may range from mild to severe and can appear two to 14 days after exposure to the virus.

Symptoms to Check for Daily Prior to Leaving Home for School:

- Fever of 100°F or higher*
- Cough*
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing*
- Loss of taste or smell*
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your child is experiencing **one of the top five symptoms*** (fever, cough, difficulty breathing, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell) consult your healthcare provider. If your provider suspects your child has COVID-19, you must isolate your child for 10 days. He or she cannot return to school until symptom-free for 24 hours. If your child is evaluated by a healthcare provider and is not considered a probable or confirmed case, he or she can return to school after they are symptom-free and fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication. You must also have a note from your health care provided before returning to school if your child has one or more of the top five symptoms*.

If your child has **two or more of the lesser symptoms (muscle or body aches, headaches, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting or diarrhea)** you must keep your child at home until they are symptom-free and fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication.
